2. "Ignorance of the law is no excuse!" What is meant by this statement? Explain the purpose of law in society and outline how a serious offence committed by a minor is administered by the Jamaican Legal System?

3. Sports and Physical Education programs at an institution must adhere to certain precautions and rules to reduce the likelihood of lawsuits and minimize liabilities by teachers and coaches. Discuss.

4. In (Barrera v. Dade County School Board, 1979) an eight-year-old girl was injured while working at one of three gymnastics stations set up for the physical class of 15 students. After being pushed off a balance beam another student fell on the girl, injuring her. The teacher who was working with a student at another station did not see when the accident occurred.

Discuss the issues of supervision and safety in this case and advise the girl's parents?
